Which Unit Are You Going To?

Unit 1:

Raintree & Willowcreek

Unit 1 is considered our high assistance area. Most of the individuals in this area will need lots of staff assistance to complete many of their daily living skills and other tasks. Some individuals who reside in Unit 1 may need to use wheelchairs, feeding tubes, oxygen tanks, etc. Individuals residing in Unit 1 have limited verbal skills or may be nonverbal, have limited range of motion, and may have more medical needs. It's important to note that individuals in this unit may experience big emotions and may need help with self-regulation. Individuals are less likely to be discharged from this unit.

Unit 2:

Ash, Deer Crossing, Oakridge, & Pineridge (Pine)

Unit 2 is considered our low assistance area. Most of the individuals in this area will need little to no assistance to complete many of their daily living skills and other tasks. The individuals who live in this unit may need support managing big emotions, physical behavior, following their programs, learning appropriate social skills, etc. Individuals residing in Unit 2 are commonly ambulatory, verbal and may require extra support from the behavior team and mental health therapists. Individuals can be discharged from this unit.

Unit 3:

Apple Grove, Bear River, Cascade Springs, Quailrun, & Sunset

Unit 3 is considered our intermediate unit. The individuals who live in these buildings may need support completing their daily living skills, managing big emotions and following their programs. Individuals residing in unit 3 may use adaptive equipment, might be ambulatory, verbal or non-verbal and need additional support from behavior specialists and mental health therapists. Individuals can be discharged from this unit.
